



Obituary.

Catherine Walden Myer.

Buffalo Enquirer.

Monday 20 FEB 1893:

By cable news reached Buffalo from London Sunday that Mrs. Catherine Walden Myer had died after an illness of several months consequent upon a painful accident, which befell her some time ago. Deceased was a daughter of Judge Walden, who came to Buffalo in 1806 and married here in 1812. Here he remained till his death in 1857. The year of his marriage he was elected to the Legislature, in 1821 he was the first Judge of Erie County, in 1828 he was a Presidential elector for Mr. Adams and in 1838 was Mayor of Buffalo. His daughter Catherine, the deceased, was married to Albert J. Myer, then an assistant surgeon in the United States Army, who served with unusual distinction through the Civil War and was appointed chief of the signal service corps, after which he won the familiar title of "Old Probs." Mrs. Myer, after leaving Buffalo, resided for a time in Washington, and the last three years of her life has been spent abroad. Six children survive Mrs. Myer: two sons, Albert J. Myer of this city and Walden Myer who is studying at Oxford, and four daughters, who were with her at the time of her death. The body will probably be brought to Buffalo for interment.
